Join the DMVA in raising awareness about scams and exploitation involving veteran benefits

There are nearly 800,000 veterans in Pennsylvania and over half of them are age 60 and older.

Veterans may be eligible for a wide array of benefits from both the Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA) and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (commonly referred to as the VA). One such benefit is a VA pension.

Unfortunately, there are unscrupulous people who are preying on veterans, particularly older veterans, to profit from their desire to apply for the benefits they earned while defending our country and our freedoms.

The DMVA wants you to know that free and safe assistance is available to help veterans and their beneficiaries apply for veteran benefits, including VA pension. The DMVA asks for your assistance to help raise awareness of this issue in your community. Together we can reduce the likelihood of scams, fraud and exploitation against our veterans and their benefits!

How can you help?

Raise awareness in two simple steps!

<u>Step 1:</u> Educate yourself and your coworkers with this <u>short presentation</u> on veteran pension poaching, how to recognize it, avoid it, and report it.

Step 2: Use the toolkit to educate the community.

The <u>toolkit</u> contains materials in English and Spanish that can be printed or shared electronically as well as social media content. Please feel free to use the materials within the toolkit at your discretion to educate your staff, clients and patients, family, friends, and community.



WHAT IS VETERAN

Veteran pension poaching is when scammers or dishonest financial planners prey on those seeking help to apply for the benefits they have earned through their military service.



HOW CAN YOU HELP VETERANS AVOID PENSION POACHING?



Be sure that a veteran you advocate for always uses assistance from a County Director of Veterans Affairs or another Accredited Veteran Services Officer (VSO) when applying for veteran benefits.

FREE SAFE AVAILABLE!

A VSO will help explain, complete and submit federal or state veteran benefits applications for free, s veterans should never pay to apply for benefits they earned thanks to service to our nation.

Keep alert for scams involving the benefits you've earned through your military service! Veterans and their beneficiaries should never pay:

- For forms or to submit applications
- For a promise of eligibility for a pension
- To restructure assets in order to "qualify" for benefits
- To receive a lump sum payment on a pension
