Federal Public Health Emergency (PHE)

PHE renewed 7/15/2022

Appendix K

- In place until 6 months after federal PHE ends
 - Cap exceptions
 - Enhanced rates for CPS & transport trip
- Planning for 'unwinding' of authorities



ID/A Waivers Renewals – Temporary Extension

- CMS issued Request for Additional Information (RAI)
- ODP requested 90 day extension through 9/30/2022
- Proposed changes
 - PHE 'unwinding' provisions
 - Services delivered using remote technology teleservice
 - Remote Support (distinct service definition)
 - Supports Coordination monitoring
 - P/FDS remote monitoring, can take place 1 time out of the 4 yearly required face-to-face monitorings.
 - Consolidated & Community Living remote monitoring can take place 3 out of the 6 required face-to-face monitorings per year.



Pandemic Recovery

- Quality & Risk Management
 - Continued process improvements
 - Simplification, ECM
- Pick-up Momentum on Initiatives
 - Employment, life sharing, supported living, lifecourse, children with medical complexities, technology
- Staffing Shortages
 - 4 prong strategy (rates & 1x, credentialling, tech, PDS)
 - Quality, efficiencies ISP staffing ratio work
 - New approaches to workforce recruitment and retention
- Capitalize on Opportunities from Pandemic
 - Remote services, use of technology
 - Person-centered re-evaluate service arrangements, staffing arrangements



Continued Professionalization of Workforce

- Standard Occupational Classification
- Standardized credentialing which promotes
 - Competencies & improved quality of service delivery
 - Retention (competency, satisfaction, tie to pay)
 - Portability & efficiencies in training requirements
 - Career ladder
- Pipeline/apprenticeship
