

Rec #1 Strategies



- Focus on communication in the individual planning process
- Identify funding avenues for effective communication supports
- Address the lack of Communication Specialists and clinicians with the expertise in communication
- Recognize and accommodate primary languages; provide materials and translation
- Promote generic social change by building capacity in understanding and supporting people with nontraditional communication needs

- Newly enrolled Deaf participants:
 - No automatic communication assessment
 - Will get a consultation with the Deaf Services Coordinator

 - Recommend an assessment, if applicable
